1. Whaitua programme communications

Alastair Smaill, Whaitua Project Manager, gave a verbal update to the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee regarding region-wide communications in relation to water and the role of whaitua committees. These messages will be communicated through radio, newspaper, film and poster channels.

2. Election of Chair, Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee

The election of Chair of the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee followed an election by majority process.

Four members of the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee were nominated for election to the role of Chair. Each nominee was seconded. The nominees were: David Holmes, Peter Gawith, Esther Dijkstra, and Rebecca Fox.

Following three rounds of voting, Peter Gawith was elected as Chair of the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee. Subsequently, Peter Gawith moved that runner-up, Esther Dijkstra, be made Deputy Chair and this was approved by the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee members.

3. Guiding principles of the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee

Rawiri Smith, member of the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee and the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Project Team, provided a short history on the development of the principles to guide the review of the Regional Plan by Te Upoko Taiao – Natural Resource Management Committee of Greater Wellington Regional Council. These principles are embedded within the Terms of Reference of the Ruamāhanga Whaitua Committee. Rawiri also provided a Wairarapa perspective of the principles.
