SM1 responded, Ahikouka. We happen to have one of the deepest sections. The last time they turned up here we weren't even consulted. The first thing I knew when I came home from work was the piles of mud inside my property that no one had asked me about	NOTE	
TL advised that's not what we want. We don't want surprises like that, so I do apologise that that's happened to you	NOTE	
SM1 advised that it happened to all the neighbours either side of me as well, they had no idea and got landed with piles of mud and when they dig so deep, its actually deep blue clay and it goes hard	NOTE	
TL responded, yes that's not correct at all, and I do apologise. Feedback from Ahikouka Drainage Scheme is that you are almost suggesting that you want to disband the scheme and sort of give everything back to the landowner to manage?	NOTE	
SM1 advised that we would have to survey the members of the scheme, there are very few of us online, but I'm happy to get around them, there is 18 of them and I would probably need a list. I know all of my neighbours, but there may be some that I'm not aware of due to land ownership and things. But most of its pretty self-explanatory of who's in the scheme and to deliver them a bit of survey of what's been discussed here, and the way forward wouldn't take much at all	NOTE

SM4 raised a concern regarding the Manai road drain; when we had lots and lots of rain in February the drain was more or less chocker and there was hardly any water running down the far end of it, it was more or less all dammed up because of all the junk and everything in it and then that built up on our property and it nearly came into our house. We have put a drain in ourselves, right along and that's (since) helped it, still there is other properties that I would like to go and have a bit of a walk with someone that have dammed up the jolly creek and that is not letting the water get away and that's created less fall for our water that's running off our property. There needs to be something done about it because we nearly ended up with water through our house because of the creek being dammed up by someone. I actually went walking through the property and all of a sudden, they let the water go. That shouldn't be happening, its causing flooding and that its not the weed in the creek its actually the level of the creek has been lifted by being dammed up further on down the	NOTE	



	track. I would never have noticed if I didn't go for a walk through the property, I shouldn't have been walking through
